I have been considering applying to Swale CCTV to place a temporary camera at that location, however I unless anyone can provide me differing information to what I have been given, I don't think it will be best placed there. On that note, if I can justify the requirement, I am able to apply for temporary CCTV to be placed in locations that might be experiencing persistent ASB or crime et. If my application is approved, all Swale CCTV need to be able to place a camera up is an electrical supply; they can use the supply from a lamppost. Moving

Comment Details Commenter Type: Parish Stance: Customer objects to the Planning Application Comment Reasons: Comment: Upchurch Parish Council wishes to register its OBJECTION in the strongest terms. Policy The site is not allocated in the current adopted Local Plan [LP] for Swale. The site is outside any of the built-up areas of the village. This area is regarded as countryside being outside of any built up environment of Upchurch The development pays no regards to the settlement gaps between urban and countryside The site is within an Important Local Countryside Gap, see LP Policy DM25. The LP strategy housing policy for Upchurch may be found in 4.3.21 to 23 which importantly states in 4.3.22 "Development at [this Tier 5 village] is not required to meet the LP housing target." This is a loss of habitat for protected species (lizards and Slowworms). Overdevelopment, Services and Infrastructure Otterham Quay Lane is a main highway connecting the Lower Rainham Road to the A2 with which Canterbury Lane has a junction. Currently significant levels of [Medway] development is taking place along the Lower Rainham Road. Otterham Quay lane has seen a recent large amount of [Medway] development, with more to come. Development in Swale [not allocated in the LP] will also be taking place on land bounded by Otterham Quay Lane and the Lower Rainham Road. In consequence Canterbury Lane, which is at best a rural lane, has become a much-used link to Oak Lane in Upchurch. The highways in this area are creaking under the strain and with further development already granted causes considerable concern as there is no way of improving infrastructure in this area such that "traffic will freely flow". This and the other developments currently either underway or due to start shortly will only add to the already overloaded and over stretched highway and infrastructure in this area and again raises concerns over air quality. Canterbury lane is not suitable for increase of traffic even with a limited widening to the west end. The development is remote from both the village of Upchurch and Rainham which will encourage use of private cars and increase pollution. Local public bus transport is basic and limited and will not support the residents. The development of this application site is remote from services, already under pressure, in Swale and Medway which will increase the need for personal transport putting pressure on an overloaded road system. There is already an overload of new development resulting in issues on local roads , services, doctors, dentists and hospitals. Swale Borough Council has in the past refused permissions in the area Otterham Quay Lane with the exception of the reuse of "brown field sites" UPC supports the many residents who have commented in detail on these points. It is not possible for this development to mitigate the demonstrable harm it will cause through Section 106 and/or Section 278 agreements and the application must therefore be refused. A further concern UPC wishes to refer to the details of the preapplication advice received in the application form. The words are either the applicant's version of what the officer said/wrote or are the officer's version of what was said/written. It needs to be explained why this officer is creating policy by suggesting that the valid objections to this application will be ignored by Swale for the sake of granting approval. Planning Policy comes from the NPF and locally for the LP from Swale politicians. This pre-application advice is also concerning since if the application is refused [as it should be it will be read by an Inspector at Appeal as "Swale has no objection". We would like a specific response to this concern from the Chief Executive.
